### Tax Seminar April 17

#### Part 1 – 6pm to 9pm

NTNU international researcher support and the Trondheim tax office are offering free tax seminar on 17 April to help you understand and complete your Norwegian tax return. As an NTNU employee, you must file a tax return in Norway. The Norwegian government will soon send you a tax form containing some of your personal information. You have to double-check this information and complete the form. The deadline for filing your return is April 30. The seminar is an introduction to the Norwegian tax system. General information: The taxpayers obligations in Norway, rights, tax return, how to submit tax return, personal id-number, valid documentation, tax card, taxation of income, residency for tax purposes, deductions, assessment in advance of foreign employees, the special tax exemption, rules for foreign researcher and teachers, tax assessment notice and useful web-sites.

### Individual tax guidance April 18

#### Part 2 – from 4pm to 9pm (15 min each)

NTNU international researcher support and the Trondheim tax office are offering free tax guidance to help you complete your Norwegian tax return. The Tax Return contains a suggestion from the Tax Authorities. It is sent out from the Tax Authorities to the registered address by the end of March/beginning of April. The deadline for handing it to the Tax Office is 30th April. You need to control it and correct it if there are any errors in it. If you have questions about taxation of income, residency for tax purposes, deductions in your tax return, you can sign up for a bit of individual guidance (max 15 minutes).
