ENG-GLOBALLY-08-2016: Scope (I)

EU-China innovation platform on sustainable urbanisation

(1.5 M€/3y, CSA)

- bring together policy makers, industry, academia and other stakeholders in EU and China
- develop joint strategies and joint projects
- promote linkages between sustainable urbanisation demonstration projects in European and Chinese cities
- run a competition that will lead to the selection of a small number of demonstration sites in China and in Europe
- suggest the network infrastructures (energy, transport, ICT, water, waste management, compact urban development, municipal finances etc.) that would need to be put in place in these sites
- suggest possible financing means, as well as demonstration projects with conditions that encourage co-investment by Chinese and EU partners in intelligent solutions for sustainable urbanisation
- build as much as possible on existing initiatives

Cultural and socio-economic aspects of urban issues in China (2.5 M€/3y, Research and Innovation Action)

- take into consideration the essential elements of city development, such as infrastructures, regulatory regimes, taxation, health, education and culture
- contribute to an improved reciprocal knowledge on urbanisation processes between the EU and China
- benefit from access to data and expertise from both EU and China
- propose new models of sustainable urban development adapted to local socio-economic, cultural and political specificities
