	<p>December 16, 8.15-10, Dragvoll, HF faculty, meeting room 7 (building 2, level 5) Short introductions á 10 minutes, followed by plenary discussion:</p> <p>Eivin Røskaft (Biology, NT): Population growth as a driver of biodiversity loss in Tanzania (Africa). Supplement by Haakon Lein (Geography, SVT).</p> <p>Stefan Pauliuk (Industrial Ecology, IVT): Strategies for decoupling energy and material throughput from human well-being. Three case studies for China. A large fraction of energy and material production is devoted to building up and maintaining in-use stocks of buildings, infrastructure, and products, which contribute to the well-being of people. We studied how energy and material throughput can be decoupled from the service provided by in-use stocks to achieve substantial reductions of negative environmental impacts. We developed long-term scenarios for the energy and material demand for building up and maintaining stocks of residential buildings, passenger cars, and steel in China.</p> <p>Siri Granum Carson (Philosophy, HF): Political CSR' as a driver for sustainable development in developing countries. Concepts like 'political CSR' and 'corporate citizenship' seem to imply that corporations have extended social and political responsibilities, among other things when it comes to governance of natural resources in the countries where they operate. Does it make sense to argue that corporations are responsible, not simply for managing their own dealings with natural resources sustainably, but to take measures towards avoiding environmental degradation and secure a more fair distribution in the countries or regions where they operate?</p> <p>Hans Skotte (Urban Design and Planning, AB): Sustainable urban development in the global south' - a contradiction in terms? We have to re-conceptualize the city if we are to make sense of, the urban realities of the Global South and act strategically towards a sustainable future. It is a waste of time and efforts to prescribe (green) action based on our Northern references. By 2050 almost 80% of the urban population will live in cities of the South, in countries with weak state institutions, and few human and financial resources. How do we envision 'sustainable urban development' under conditions like these? I have some ideas based on experiences from East Africa.</p>

Planning is here viewed both as a process including cooperation and participation, and also as concrete solutions. Thus, planning might be a tool for developing sustainable solutions, as well as a democratic process in developing understanding and support for sustainable solutions.</p> <p>Karoline Daugstad (Department of Geography, SVT): Local participation in nature protection; issues with relevance for sustainability. Being an experienced human geographer Daugstad has since long been working with landscape studies, in particular local management of protected areas. Here she will look at connections between local participation and its relevance for sustainable development.</p> <p>May Thorseth (Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies, HF): Discursive and institutional obstacles to sustainable development. Obstacles to sustainable development are sometimes caused by conflicting discourses on sustainability and growth, and also global and context-insensitive governance of natural resources.
