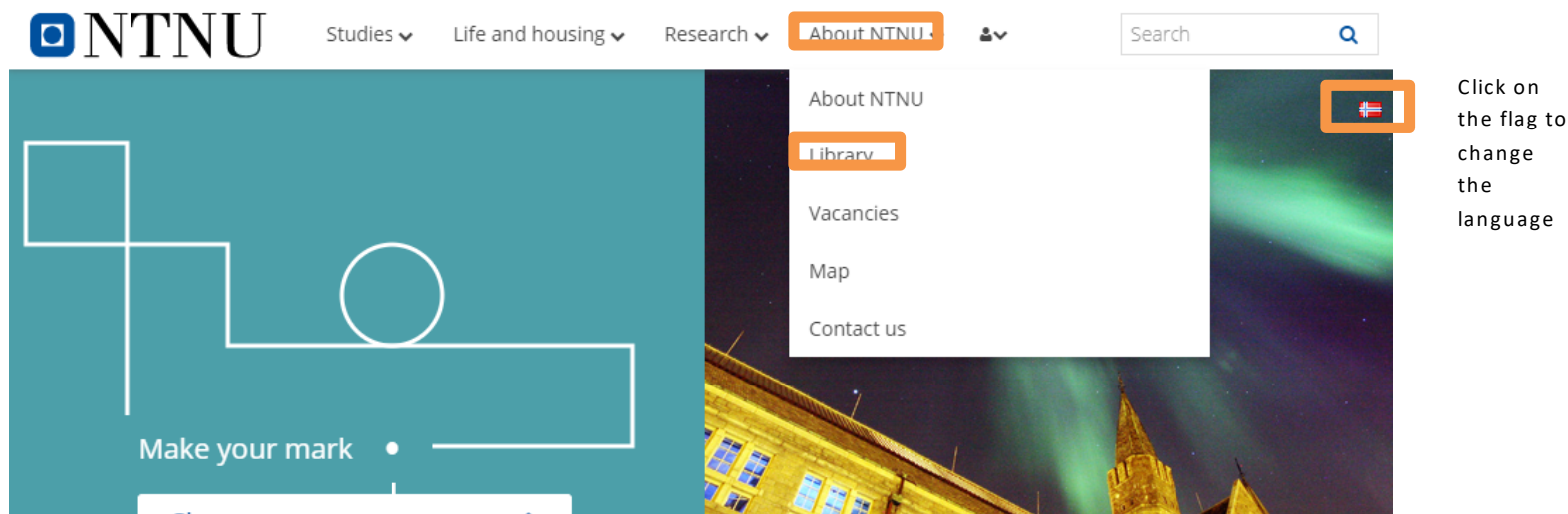

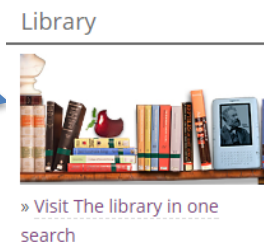

  - Go to NTNU website (ntnu.no), click About NTNU and then Library.




- On NTNU website, almost at the bottom, click on this picture


# Oria

- What is **Oria**?
  - Oria allows you to search the library's printed and electronic collections: books, articles, journals, theses, music, movies, and more.
  - 3 ways of finding Oria:
    - Oria.no
    - Search box on NTNU's University Library webpage ([ntnu.edu/ub](https://ntnu.edu/ub))
    - On Innsida
- Why use the Sign In button?
  - It's not necessary to sign in to search. But if you want to order and/or renew loans, you have to sign in. You can also save search strings and references once you have signed in.
  - To sign in use your **NTNU username** and **password**.



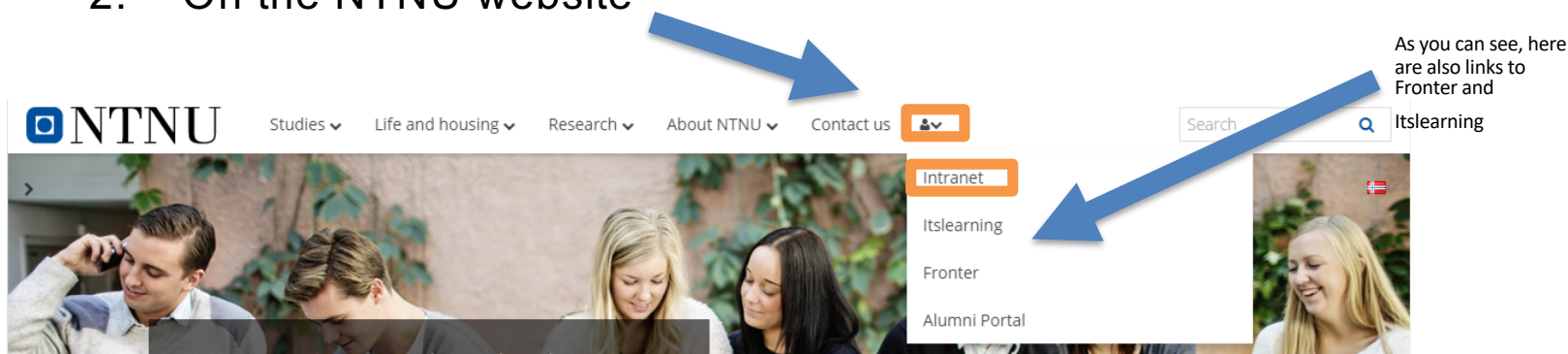


# Innsida



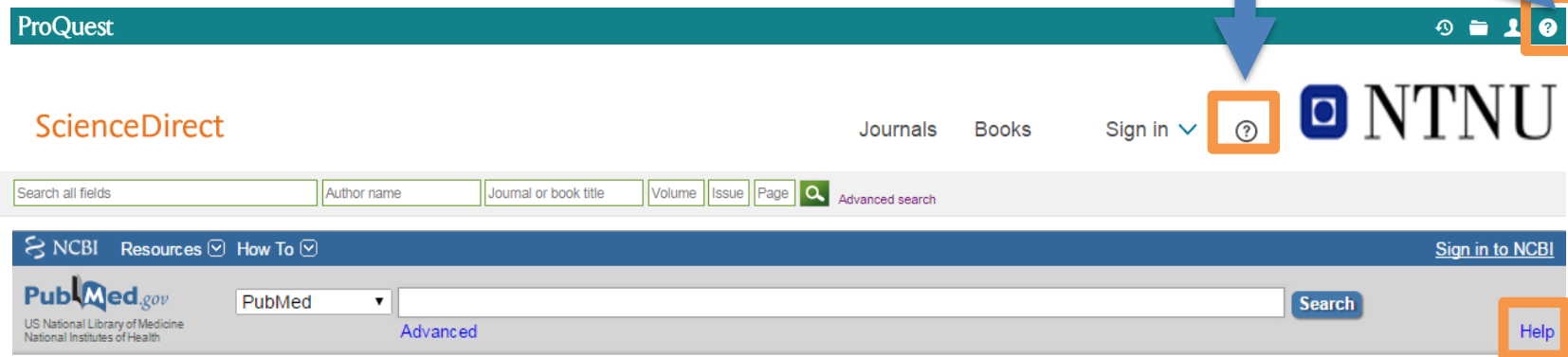

- You can make your own account in many databases. If you choose to register, you can save, manage and organize search strings as well as articles. For more information, check out the help section for the database.

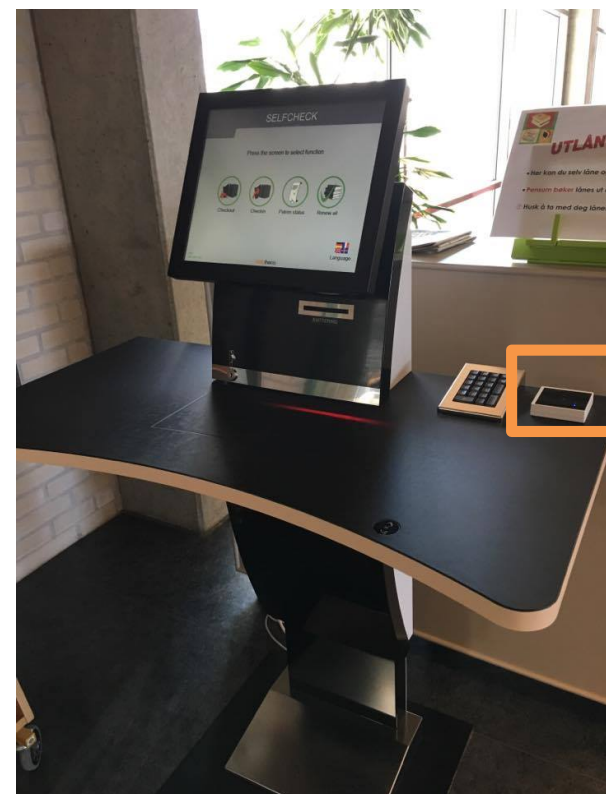
# VPN

- If you need IT help please come to the library and talk to the Oracle support services



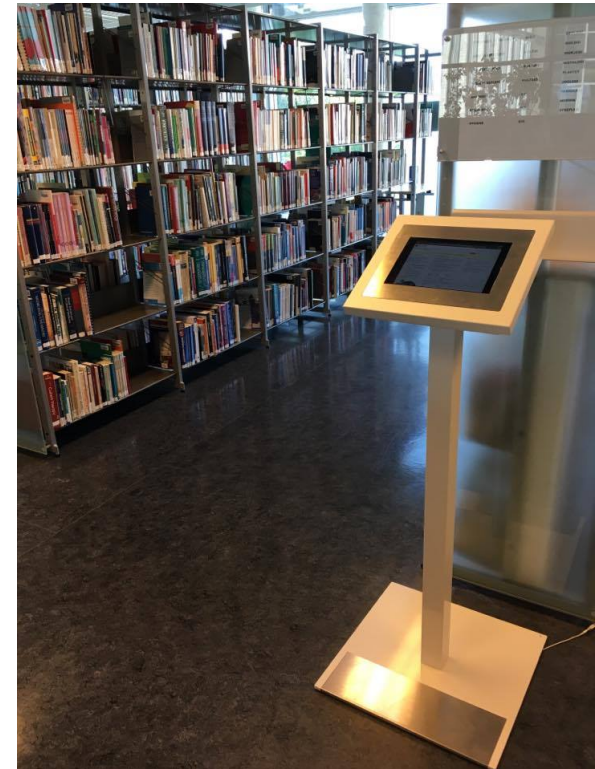
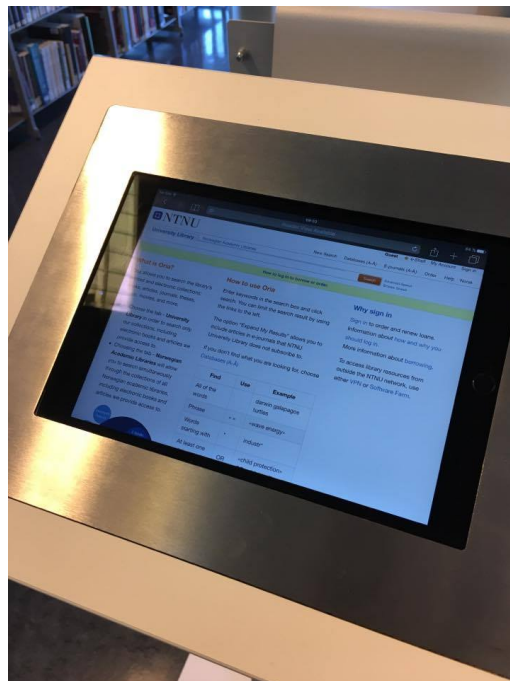
# Self-service desk at the library
