## Between Part 1 and Part 2 of the course

### Compulsory activity 1: Two colloquium reports

Colloquium groups of 3-5 people will be organized by the course coordinator on the first day, based on the submitted pre-course task.

Conduct (at least) two colloquium meetings live or online. Use the guidelines for reports 1a and 1b for your discussions. Share the responsibility for convening and chairing meetings, for taking notes, writing and to submit the report within the group. The reports must include notes on questions that were raised and discussed, and new insights, as well as the names of who attended the meeting and when/where the meeting was held. Use individual names to clarify details of what each group member contributed with in the discussions.

### Collective colloquium report 1a: Theoretical outline, 3-5 pages

- Use relevant literature selected from the course reading list and create an overview of the different philosophical paradigms.
- The overview can be structured by for example a timeline, language/continent or something else.
