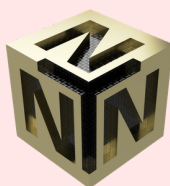
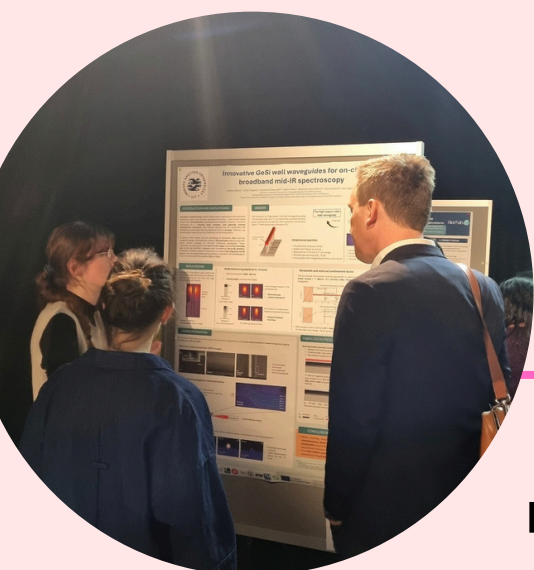

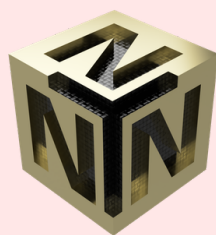

The Sensor Decade is the largest national meeting for industry, research institutes, and academia working with sensors and sensing. The program covers a wide range of topics, from sensor materials and integration to design and microfabrication, and from AI-enhanced sensing to real-world applications across different industries. One of the things that makes this meeting stand out is its strong industry presence. Most of the Norwegian companies involved in sensor development and sensor applications take part. It is the place to be, if you want to know how Norwegian industry leaders in sensors, electronics, and optics see the future of this industry, discuss competence needs, or learn where companies are heading in a short and long time perspective. It's also a good place to meet potential collaborators or employers.

TNNN will cover the conference registration fee and offer a travel grant of 3000Nok for TNNN members that will attend the conference (travel grants are limited to members from outside the Oslo area).
