This is Maya, just a normal human with worries about the future of our planet.




Maya is tired of seeing plastic waste littering

The problem is, she has no way of achieving this yet..


The Solution =

With that, we allow for producers and Maya to collaborate and contribute to reducing the use of SUPs.



About plastic in oceans

At least 14 million tons of plastic end up in the ocean every year, and plastic makes up 80% of all marine debris found from surface waters to deep-sea sediments

Plastic bottles and food containers are the second most common ocean plastic waste after plastic bags

Freedom over choosing the amount of the product


Less waste, and less money spent on bottles for all parties
