The Norwegian Research Council has pre-announced a call for collaborative projects that contribute to sustainable health promotion and preventive measures, treatment and services to counteract loneliness, exclusion and social inequality in health.

Deadline: 10 June 2026

Budget: 4 000 000 – 16 000 000 NOK

Duration: 24 – 48 months

NB: This year's thematic collaborative calls from the Norwegian Research Council are anticipated to open in March/April.

CoMed is a laboratory animal facility approved for rodents, rabbits, and pigs. They offer housing and care for laboratory animals, rent out laboratories and operating rooms, and assist researchers with training, planning, and conducting experiments.

The large animal facility also organizes various types of courses for healthcare personnel, in close collaboration with St. Olav's Hospital.
