Horizon Europe

Reminder: Horizon Europe Health Cluster and Cancer Missions

Calls for proposals from Horizon Europe's Pillar II Health Cluster (RIA/IA) and Cancer Missions (RIA/IA) will open in May.

These are large, collaborative, top-down (i.e. thematic) projects requiring the participation of a minimum of 3 partners from at least three countries. At least one partner must be at an institution in an EU country. There are several events related to these calls coming up this spring which are described further in this issue.

It is possible to apply either as a *project coordinator* (where you would be managing the project and its partners), or as a *partner* on a project coordinated elsewhere.

Calls Open: 06 May 2905 (Cancer Missions)

22 May 2025 (Health Cluster)

Deadline(s): 18 September 2025

16 April 2026 (second stage of two stage calls)

Support Available from MH and NTNU:

- Proposals to Horizon Europe's collaborative calls as coordinator or partner are both eligible <u>for project</u> <u>establishment funding from NTNU.</u>
- MH has a dedicated EU projects manager, Andrea <u>Nilsen</u>, who works as an administrative manager on Horizon Europe projects. She may be available to take on a new coordinated project at MH, if one is awarded.
- Søknadshjelpen provides **hands-on support** with proposal writing, the project budget, the application process, and post award, tailored to your needs.

To qualify, the **deadline to submit an expression of interest (EOI) as coordinator is extended to March 31**st. We will accept later EOI's on a case-by-case basis, however the level of support available may be limited based on our capacity.

NOTE: Access to PES funding is also connected to the submission and approval of the EOI.

 distribute this widely to relevant research groups and
 institutions across Europe.
- Attend the Pillar 2 information and networking event here at NTNU on April 7th.

- <u>Send us your pitch</u> for collaboration and we will forward
 it to NTNU's Brussels Office. If they think it's a strong
 pitch, they will use their extensive networks in Europe to
 share it with relevant groups.

Upcoming Deadline: Seed funding from NTNU Health and Life Science

NTNU's strategic area within Health and Life Science is announcing this year's opportunity for seed funding, which is directed towards strengthening applications for external project funding.

Deadline: 05 May 2025

NTNU Health and Life Science aims to provide knowledge and technology for health-promoting societies and a sustainable health service. Projects that contribute towards these main goals may apply for funding. A special focus will be placed on developing knowledge and technology in the following thematic areas:

- One Health: Understanding how the interdependence between humans, animals, plants, microbes, and their shared environment affect health of living organisms.
- Healthy life spans: Understanding causes of "lifestyle" diseases, how to prevent them and what promotes healthy lives.
- Value-based health services: Understanding how health systems and -services can be designed and managed in order to improve quality of care, give value to the patient and the society, with an efficient use of resources.

Announcement: Get a free PhD! Distribution process of RRS positions (formerly RSO) for 2025

Proposals for NFR and EU projects worth over 6 million NOK can now include a 3-year PhD position as own financing

MH-faculty will award a 3-year PhD position as own financing to awarded RCN and HEU projects where MH-faculty is allocated at least 6 million NOK of the externally financed budget.

The faculty will cover salary + social costs and operating costs in compliance with the current routines for RRS (formerly RSO) positions at the faculty.

The development of the allocation process and prioritization criteria is ongoing and will be published here, on the Grants Office website and Innsida once finalized. The faculty will also distribute the announcement to all department heads.

Are you the supervisor on a MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowship application or do know someone who is applying?

On the morning of April 29th and 30th 2025, NTNU is organizing an online symposium for applicants to the 2025 MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships and their supervisors.

Date: April 29th - 30th

Deadline for registration: April 22nd.

The Symposium aims to provide applicants and their supervisors with all the information required to prepare a competitive proposal. We will cover key aspects of the scheme and the proposal templates, including top tips and common pitfalls. The event will take place online and is free of charge.

The MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships are highly competitive, but the rewards are significant, starting with the very impact on the research career of successful applicants. The 2025 submission deadline to MSCA-PF is September 10th.
