Info-bit: What is an Expression of Interest (EOI) and why you should submit one

Submitting an EOI is *not* necessary for you to receive our handson-support with your application, but we do highly encourage it for several reasons.

- 1. We know your time is valuable, so we want to make sure it is well spent on competitive applications with a realistic chance for success. The EOI will be assessed based on the maturity of the research idea, whether it fits the scop of the call, and whether your experience fits the scope of the call (in the case of experience-based call types like FRIPRO and ERC). This allows us to give early feedback, before you've devoted, days, weeks or months on a proposal.
- 2. For EU grants, you need to submit an EOI if you plan to apply for project establishment funding (PES). To support the application process for ERC grants, for example, you may qualify for up to 75.000 NOK from NTNU, with up to 300.000 NOK topped up by MH faculty.* The deadline for the ERC EOI is therefore important for the faculty to keep track of how many PES grants will be funded, as resources are limited. Further information about OES can be found here.

If you contact us without an EOI, remember the earlier we hear from you, the more likely we are to have the capacity to provide thorough assistance with enough time for you to apply any feedback.

^{*}Unfortunately, currently only ERC applications qualify for a possible faculty top up. All EU grant types are eligible for PES funding from NTNU.

Horizon Europe

Upcoming Calls: First draft of Horizon Europe Health Cluster 2026 and 2027 work programme is available.

We have received the first draft of Horizon Europe's Health Cluster work program for 2026/2027. This is an early draft so the information within it is still under development: some topics may be merged, new topics may be added, and grant sizes and deadlines are still tentative. However, it is a good indication of the thematic priorities for the topics in next year's calls.

It's not too early to begin networking and talking with potential collaborators if you believe you may be ready and interested in applying to any of these topics as a partner or coordinator next year. Upcoming Deadline: 2026 call for research funding from Samarbeidsorganet - Helse Midt-Norge

The 2006 calls for regional research funding from Samarbeidsorganet have now been published on the Central Norway Regional Health Authority's (Helse Midt-Norge) website.

The call for proposals includes:

- Three-year PhD fellowships
- Three-year Postdoctoral Fellowships
- Three Year Researcher Fellowships
- Project Fundds (500.000-1.500.00 NOK per year, max 3 years)

Upcoming Deadline: The Norwegian Cancer Society Researcher Projects 2025

The Norwegian Cancer Society has announced the 2025 call for research projects, with 47MNOK earmarked for breast cancer, 8 MNOK for cancer researcher outside of the Oslo area and aspiring cancer researchers, and 130MNOK open for all areas of cancer research.

Deadline: May 27th, 13:00 pm

Support Activities

Announcement: The allocation process for RRS positions (formerly RSO) for 2025 as been decided

Proposals for NFR and EU projects worth over 6 million NOK can now include a 3-year PhD position as own financing

MH-faculty awards a 3-year PhD position as own financing to awarded NFR and HEU projects where MH-faculty is allocated at least 6 million NOK of the externally financed budget.

The faculty covers salary, social costs and operating costs in compliance with the current routines for RRS positions at the faculty.

Requirements to qualify:

 You must notify the faculty that you are applying no later than 2 weeks before the application deadline/scheduled date of proposal submission (open-ended).

The following information is required:

- The name of the call for proposals
- The project title
- The name and department of the project leader
- The total budget for the project
- MH-faculty's share of the externally financed budge.
- If the MH-faculty is a partner, please include the name and organization of the project manager.
- The proposal must be supported by the head of department. An email from the head of department confirming their support for the proposal is sufficient.

Please submit this information, including documentation of support from the head of your department by email to laila.berg@ntnu.no.

The MH-faculty reserves its right to use the "first come, first served" principle for prioritization if the RRS-resources for 2025 earmarked for this purpose is exceeded.

Retrospective effect

Proposals submitted between January 1 – April 15, 2025 can also qualify for this own financing. You must notify the faculty that you have applied as soon as possible and **no later than**April 15, 2025
