Reminder: RRS positions for successful HEU and NFR proposals

Are you planning to submit a proposal to a HEU or NFR Call this fall? Remember that RRS-positions (formerly RSO) are available for NFR and Horizon Europe projects over 6 million NOK.

MH-faculty awards a **3-year PhD position as own financing to awarded NFR and HEU projects** where MH-faculty is allocated at least 6 million NOK of the externally financed budget. The faculty covers salary, social costs and operating costs in compliance with the current routines for RRS positions at the faculty.

Requirements to qualify:

 You must notify the faculty that you are applying no later than two weeks before the application deadline or scheduled date of proposal submission (for openended applications).

The following information is required:

The name of the call for proposals

The project title

The name and department of the project leader

The total budget for the project

MH-faculty's share of the externally financed budge.

If the MH-faculty is a partner, please include the name and organization of the project manager.

The proposal must be supported by the head of department. An email from the head of department confirming their support for the proposal is sufficient.

Please submit this information, including documentation of support from the head of your department by email to Laila Berg.

The MH-faculty reserves its right to use the "first come, first served" principle for prioritization if the annual RRS-resources earmarked for this purpose are exceeded.

Other Calls for Funding

Update: Own Contribution for CAG 2026 call – Offer from MH

Samarbeidsorganet invites applications for Clinical Academic Groups (CAG) for 2026. Since 2021 there is a requirement for a personal contribution in the form of a three-year PhD scholarship from the university or university college from which the application originates. A guarantee of funding from the dean's office must be attached to the application.

The MH Faculty at NTNU will contribute a 3-year PhD position funded from the faculty's RRS framework as a personal contribution in the event of a successful CAG project for which the MH faculty is project manager or deputy project manager. The faculty covers salary + social costs and operations in line with the current framework for the faculty's RRS positions.

To qualify, the project manager / deputy project manager at MH must **submit a request**, containing the application title, name of the project manager and deputy project manager, and documentation of support from the head of the department **no later than September 5, 2025** by email to Laila Berg.

An email from the head of department confirming support for the application is sufficient. The faculty will ensure that a guarantee of funding from the dean's office is sent to qualified applicants by the application deadline.

CAG application deadline: September 12, 2025, 15:00.

The webinar will cover how to plan and formulate a strong proposal, with a focus on tailoring the application to ERC's expectations and avoiding common pitfalls. The course combines presentations, examples, and interactive exercises.

Are you preparing a submission for the 2025 Horizon Europe Research Infrastructure Calls? RICH Europe is offering a free indepth proposal review for up to 8 proposals.

Through detailed, constructive feedback from experienced Horizon Europe evaluators (officially appointed by the European Commission) applicants can refine their submissions and significantly strengthen their chances of securing funding. The service is free of charge for the proposers.

What is it?

The Proposal Check Event is organized by **RICH Europe**, a network of Research Infrastructure National Contact Points (NCPs) that provides services across Europe with the aim of strengthening the European research infrastructure ecosystem.

Each consultation is tailored to the individual proposer and will take the form of a dedicated online session lasting up to two hours. Following a brief pitch by the proposer, evaluators will provide feedback on all sections of the Horizon Europe proposal Part B – Excellence, Impact, and Implementation. All information shared during the session will remain confidential.

Who can apply?

The event is aimed at proposers who intend to submit proposal for the Horizon Europe Research Infrastructure 2025 Calls in the following destinations:

HORIZON-INFRA-2025-DEV-01: Consolidation and evolution of the European Research Infrastructure Landscape

HORIZON-INFRA-2025-EOSC-01: Enabling an operational, open and FAIR EOSC ecosystem

HORIZON-INFRA-2025-SERV-01: Research infrastructures services to support health research, accelerate the green transition and the digital transformation, and advance frontier knowledge

HORIZON-INFRA-2025-TECH-01: Next generation of scientific instrumentation, tools, methods, and advanced digital solutions of research infrastructures and foster innovation and co-creation with industry

The Call Deadline is September 18th, 2025.

How to apply?

Proposers interested in applying must complete a registration process, which will be considered an Expression of Interest. Potential proposers to the Proposal Check Workshop must follow these 2 steps and deadlines:

- Register at the event by 13th August 2025 at this link
- In August 2025, registered proposers will be contacted via email and invited to submit an advanced draft of their Part B proposal for the selected INFRA topic by August 20th. Submission of this draft is a mandatory prerequisite for participation in the Proposal Check Event.
