Guidelines for student term paper

The second part of the course is organized as a seminar with presentation and discussion of the individual students' term papers. Each student will be required to comment on another student's term paper.

Seminar with student presentations:

Date: 11 March at 9:15-12:00 and 12 March at 8:15-15:00

Location: Room 103/104, Pavilion C

- The term paper must include a title and a literature list.
- The length should be min. 10 to max. 15 pages, Times New Roman 12 pt, space 1.5 (literature list not included).
- Oral presentation: Max. 10 minutes are reserved for the presentation, and 10-15 minutes for the opponent's comments and group discussion.
- The opponent's job is to read the term paper thoroughly, and comment on its weak and strong sides.
- The language for the term paper and the presentation is English.
- The term paper shall be revised after the seminar, and the student must take the comments from the opponent and the outcome of the group discussion into account.

The revised version of the term paper shall be submitted to Rannveig Singaas (rannveig.singaas@svt.ntnu.no) by **Thursday 21 May (no later than 09:00 a.m.)**.
