
3ROcean seminar: “Ecosystems and the law of the sea: Historical considerations and contemporary concerns” with Henrik Ringbom and Gard Paulsen.

Time: February 22, 13:00 AM - 16:00

Place: Trondheim, Dragvoll, «møterom 7» (Faculty meeting room, building 2, level 5).

This seminar will address some contemporary concerns regarding the relationship between international law of the sea and ecosystem based management of marine resources. Furthermore, it will also provide an historical introduction regarding ecosystems as a scientific and legal concept, linking up the core concern of the 3ROcean project of the relationship between representations and regulations. Dr. Henrik Ringbom will provide the talk regarding the contemporary concerns while Gard Paulsen will offer the short historical introduction.

Dr Henrik Ringbom is Professor II at the Scandinavian Institute of Maritime Law at the University of Oslo and Adjunct Professor at the Åbo Akademi University in Turku/Finland. From September 2017 he is also a Professor II at K.G. Jebsen Centre for the Law of the Sea, University of Tromsø. His previous work experience includes being Head of Unit for Marine Environment, Training and Statistics at the European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA) in Lisbon (2007-2012), Research Fellow at the University of Oslo (2003-2007) and Administrator at the Maritime Safety Unit of the European Commission in Brussels (1997-2003). He has published widely in the field of European and international shipping law and is the author of the book 'The EU Maritime Safety Policy and International Law' (Brill, 2008) and editor of 'Jurisdiction over Ships' (Brill, 2015). He is from November 2017 a member of the Administrative Board of the European Maritime Safety Agency (EMSA).
